Ons Plek offers a bridging school program for girls who are currently not enrolled in school to gain admittance and perform at their proper grade level. As a teacher at the school, I typically begin my mornings with the girls sharing stories, laughter, and their favorite songs. This helps us form and strengthen relationships with each other.

My life has been transformed dramatically through serving at Ons Plek. Everyday, my belief in the life-changing ability of God increases and I feel grateful to play a role in this process. I am inspired daily by the strength and resolve of the girls, and the commitment and love expressed by the staff members. Although so many of the girls have endured injustice and trauma in their lives, their past does not prevent them from experiencing moments of laughter, learning, and growth.
