He was ordained into Bishopric on the very same grounds, but only under a makeshift tent back on the 21st day of September in the year of our Lord 2003. The Diocese has come a long way since then; 21 new churches including a Cathedral has been built.

numerous institutes and projects have been initiated and the Diocese has grown into 181 churches spreading across 38 pastorates comprising of 29,750 congregational members.

Back then there were only 12 priests managing this geographically mammoth predominantly Tribal diocese and today there are 24 of them, theologically trained from reputed seminaries from within and beyond borders. The bilingual ordination service was attended by all the clergy of the Diocese, Staff members, parishioners of the different churches in the Diocese, members of the Diocesan Executive Committee, family and friends of our Bishop, the Rt. Revd. Dr. Probal Kanto Dutta.

We wish him all the best in his ministerial life and may he grow in love and peace in accordance to the will of God, serving his Maker with his, mind, heart and soul. The atmosphere was very devotional and prayerful. Every one participated equally in this prayer gathering.

The happy occassion was concluded with communal lunch.






Prayer Reflection
