Bishop Dutta Appointed as Moderator's Episcopal **Commissary to Calcutta Diocese**


Tarun Pal: On 27th August, 2018, Rt. Rev. Dr. Probal Kanto Dutta was appointed as the Moderator's Episcopal Commissary to the Diocese of Calcutta by the Church of North India. Bishop Dutta will be taking over the duties from outgoing Bishop, Rt. Rev Ashoke Biswas who had been on extension since his retirement two years earlier, in 2016. Bishop Dutta will be over-seeing the Diocese's smooth functioning. In his position as the interim diocese

head he will be fulfilling the duties of the Bishop until a new Bishop is elected.

Bishop Dutta will also be carrying out his responsibilities as the Deputy Moderator of the Church of North India and as the Bishop of the Diocese of Durgapur. Rt. Rev. Dr. Probal Kanto Dutta had been elected as the Deputy Moderator of the Church of North India in October 2017. He had taken over the role of Bishop in the Diocese of Durgapur in 2003. Since

his transition to the helm of this diocese he turned it around from an ailing diocese which was to be annexed into the Bishopric of the Diocese of Calcutta, into one of the most active dioceses in the Church of North India.

posted by my friend who works with cross-border immigrants in USA. In his post he talks about having run into two sisters from Honduras at Friendship Park which lies at the US Mexico border. They were escaping from their abusers, a gang which controlled their town and made the girls work as drug mules and slaves to the men. Refusal was met with heavy punishment, as the girls' expression and behaviour informed my friend. As the two stared at the impenetrable wall they were in tears because they were told to wait for at least two-months for an appointment by the border officials who spoke very little Spanish. They had no money or shelter or protection. My friend took them to a shelter at Camino from where they later left. This story calls attention to the fact that love is dwindling, and very fast, from the world. It brings to mind a 2003 song by the band Black Eyed Peas, "Where is the Love". In their song they question, "What happened to the values of humanity? This line rings true
