

Children Festival of Hope

Rev. Rabindranath Ray: The Diocese of Durgapur played host to the Children's Festival of Hope from 4th – 5th December, 2018. This year the theme was "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." Many children from different churches of our diocese attended the festival. Jean and Johnnie Corbett's team from USA also attended the festival which was held in our St. Michael's Golden

Jubilee Multipurpose Hall and spread over to the Parish Hall during meal time.

The first day of our festival began at 5:00 p.m. diocese. We were all given a cap with Children's Festival of Hope written on it. The programme began with a prayer followed by lighting of the candles during which we danced to the song "Light of the world". After this we sang some songs and then we performed a drama where we depicted the various

ways in which Satan tempts us and tries to claim us in order to block our access to God. The message of our drama was that if you have faith and a strong will, every temptation can be overcome and we can always return to our ever loving Heavenly Father. The students from all the other churches performed dances to Christian songs. This was followed by prayer and dinner. The next morning, after Sunday service we sang many songs

and took part in several activities. We learnt many new things; Jean Ma'am taught us about using our fingers for praying - like our thumb which refers to our family, the pointing finger refers to the leaders, the middle finger to God to say sorry; we also learnt about the armour of God and several other interesting things. We had a Bible quiz in which a student from Group B won the first position. After the quiz, we had games

and then lunch. After lunch we had some time to our selves during which many of us, including the USA Team, played flying disk.

After game time was over we went back to the Multipurpose Hall where everyone showed their talents through several dances, skits and songs. At the end of the programme all of us got together to dance; then we had our dinner and the students from other churches left for their homes. ■

Come Christmas and all of us are busy running around, trying to find that perfect gift for all our near and dear ones. The gifts under the Christmas tree make all of us so happy; opening them is another level of joy altogether. In all of our excitement, we all forget the person whose birthday we are commemorating. Jesus always reached out to the poor. But, during Christmas, most of us forget Jesus' ministry and buy into the commercialisation of the Christmas spirit.

While the concept of Christmas spirit brings to mind merry making a n d joyous celebration, we often tend to overlook or ignore those lessfortunate for us; for whom joy and merry making would involve even one hot meal. When I was younger, I remember, the new Mother Superior of our convent stopped giving us Christmas gifts during her first year. Naturally, as little children we were all very sad. But on the day last day before our boarding closed for the winter vacation, she told us something that stayed with me for life. Sr. Superior, as we called her, said, "I know all of you are sad that this year we did not get you any gift. What we did was, we gifted the children in the slums with your gift money. Now, you will all go home and have warm clothes on your back and food in Hallmark! your belly; but as you

She went on to remind us how Jesus was among the less-fortunate ones, taking birth in a stable on a cold winter night and laying there among the cattle without the comfort of a home or a crib.

Jesus' ministry involved the poor and the oppressed. He always reached out to those who were shunned by the society and he always helped those who were less-fortunate, be it the blind man, or the deaf man, or an adulteress; he welcomed them all with open arms and gave them the gift of love and care.

This Christmas, as we run around decorating our homes and buying gifts for our beloved ones, I urge all of you to pause for a second and to think about the ones who most require a gift. It could be the gift of love, of understanding, or of something as simple as hug. It most definitely does not have to be a material gift, but, if we pause for a while and spare a moment for those who are not as fortunate as us, we will, as our Sr. Superior used to say, "...be reaching out to Jesus himself ...
